### Club Spotlight: Ashley Wise

In 2008, I attended my first SCCA autocross race in Ohio and became hooked. I have always loved cars: watching racing, attending car shows, learning how to work on them myself, etc but being in the driver seat racing was a whole new level! During that time, I was racing my Cadillac CTS-V and a C5 Z06 Corvette.... American muscle cars were always in my heart. Then one day at a car meet-up I see a beautiful 2007 Lotus Elise Type 72D pull in and I fell in love. I had heard the name Lotus before but never actually saw one in person and knew nothing about them. I quickly became good friends with the wonderful owner and the day he let me ride in it was the day I told myself I was going to own a Lotus within the next 5 years. I continued doing autocross in more 'Vettes, Mustangs, and even karts but deep down I kept wishing I was in a Lotus.





In 2011 I moved to North Carolina and took a mini break from racing, but that didn't last long because I was living in an area that was filled with race shops and lots of various track options close by. I started back into doing autocross with my CTS-V and a brand new Mustang GT which was fun and all, but my eyes kept wandering astray because this SCCA region had two to three Elises (up to four or more when we had combined region events). I started debating if this was the year I'd finally go ahead and buy a Lotus, and after one of the guys let me race his Elise I told myself yes. I had a hard time deciding between an Elise or Exige and ended up deciding it would be an Exige and that I was going to track it. After a long year of searching and making offers and not being quick enough or not finding the one that had everything I wanted, I finally purchased my 2007 Exige S on Christmas 2012. I had achieved my goal! I autocrossed and tracked the car just as it was meant to do in life.

Moving to northern Virginia I was very excited to see there are a LOT of Lotus owners, especially chrome orange ones like me:) It's amazing how many wonderful people I've met through my Exige and how quirky/funny some Lotus owners are. My Exige is a peppy little beast I'm still trying to tame and it's completely different than the high horsepower muscle cars I was used to. I'll still never get over the fact that I can never simply just pull into to a gas station without having everyone come over and all of them be surprised I'm a girl driving it. I love my Lotus and all the joy it has brought me.



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### A Visit to Lotus Racing by Jeffrey Hammer

Friday, August 26, on my last day in England at the end of a 2-week family trip, I had the pleasure of doing Lotus Driving Academy Licence Level 1 (http://www.lotusdrivingacademy.com/hethel/level-1). It was a fabulous experience. The three track sessions themselves were out of this world for a novice like me. I had a left-hand drive car, awesome instructor, and precise feedback on performance driving basics. (It would have been great to stay for days 2 and 3 which Lotus offers as well.) The 220 Cup Elise is a real joy to drive. Taking laps on the same tracks used to test the factory cars, F1 cars, etc. was awe-inspiring. Even more so after the instructor did a few laps; made me realize how slow I was going and that keeping a change of clothes around is handy. I was double-lucky in that my instructor's first job at Lotus was working on the chassis for the Esprit S3 (same as the turbo cars in the U.S.). All of the hosts/drivers/guides for the day bled Lotus.

I think the real joy, though, was the factory tour and Classic Team Lotus tour. No pics allowed in the factory. We saw the Elise/Exige lines and the Evora line. No robots, all the cars are still handmade. The guide gave the stat that Nissan of Britain produces almost 500,000 cars a year and Lotus has made 100,000 in the company's lifetime. It's a fascinating process ranging across multiple buildings. We had the pleasure of seeing two nearly complete 311s interrupting the Evora line, with a special crew doing the build outside the normal crews. Just being on the floor where my Esprit was made back in 1986 gave me goosebumps. Lotus still uses a clipboard and paper printout that follows the car throughout the build, detailing options, colors, etc.

The Classic Team Lotus tour was also amazing. I am not the most knowledgeable person when it comes to Lotus and racing. I remember a bit from when I was a kid (for example, I built the Type 79 Tamiya plastic model kit). It was still really neat being around the original cars, hearing some of the stories (our guide was a 50 year Lotus veteran). I love all the JPS livery ones. Most interesting were the drawers of hand-done drawings with specs of all the cars. They are still used today to rebuild or reference the older race cars. If that place were to go up in flames, so would a large part of Lotus history. The highlight was having my picture taken with Clive Chapman. If you ever have the opportunity to go to England and do a tour (with or without the driving part), do so. It sadly came at the expense of me attending Kevin's summer party. Despite that, it was a fantastic experience.
